A LETTER FROM LEADERSHIP

Dear Beth Jacob Community,

It's with great joy that I share updates from my role as Director of Congregational Learning. As many of you know, this year has brought me full circle in a unique way, serving a congregation where I first learned so much. One of the most profound experiences of return has been our Talmud class, sitting around the very same table where I first learned Talmud with Rabbi Allen on Monday nights in 2014.

Studying Masechet Ta'anit with our wonderful community members has offered an opportunity for shared learning and growth. As we delved into Ta'anit 7a, the words of Rav Naḥman bar Yitzḥak resonated deeply: "Why are Torah matters likened to a tree... just as a small piece of wood can ignite a large piece, so too, minor Torah scholars can sharpen great Torah scholars and enable them to advance in their studies." And in the words of what Rabbi Ḥanina said, "I have learned much from my teachers and even more from my friends, but from my students I have learned more than from all of them."

True to this teaching, while I am not identifying myself as a great Torah scholar, and certainly do not see any of you as minor Torah scholars, in the spirit of Rav Nahman bar Yitzhak's words, I have learned immensely from each and every one of you. Your active participation, diverse perspectives, and thirst for knowledge have enriched my own understandings. I truly have learned even more from you, my friends.

In the words of Rabbi Hanina, I have been so fortunate to have learned from Rabbi Allen, Rabbi Rubin and daily from Rabbi Tamar, and am so grateful for her teaching and mentorship. And in the spirit of Rabbi Hanina, I have gotten to learn so much from your, from our, children.

I'm thrilled to report on the success of our Shabbat Morning School. The Torah Extravaganza was a highlight, showcasing the creativity and enthusiasm of our young learners alongside their parents. The weekly Minyan Katan continues to be an inspiring space for young children to experience the joy of communal prayer. I still tear up thinking about a conversation I had with a parent shortly after October 7th. As we walked out of Minyan Katan together he looked at me and simply said, "that was exactly what I needed." Watching our 4 and 5 year olds joyfully sing, dance and pray, the words of Modeh Ani ring out - I am thankful before You, living and enduring God, for you have mercifully restored my soul within me.

Additionally, the introduction of monthly Tot Shabbat programs has proven to be a wonderful way to connect our youngest members and their families through singing, stories, and play has been a fantastic addition to our community.

As I recently shared in a d'var Torah, we will be expanding Beth Jacob's youth educational offerings beginning this fall. We have begun the creation process by defining our educational values that will anchor our program. We are assembling a youth education task force to help me bring our vision into reality. I will continue to share updates with the community as we make our way toward September. If you are interested in the process, want to learn more, or share any ideas with me, please reach out.

While our BJUSY chapter may be small, their dedication is anything but. Our teens did a fantastic job running the annual pancake breakfast, raising nearly \$4,000.00. They stayed up nearly all night preparing the Purim carnival which was a resounding success! The energy and spirit of the day were palpable. It was a testament to the strength of our community to be able to bring the joy of Purim to us as Jews at this moment.


I would be remiss if I didn't express my deepest gratitude to our dedicated teachers and B'nai Mitzvah tutors. Their tireless efforts, patience, and love for their students are the foundation upon which our learning and growth thrive.

As we make our way towards Pesach, Z'man Heruteinu אָמֶן חֵרוּתִנוּ, the season of our freedom, we prepare to mark the biggest miracle God did for us, releasing the Isralites from bondage. In doing so, we practice two rituals that bring our attention to the smaller miracles, instituting the prayer for dew (Morid haTal, "Who brings down dew") and meticulously counting each day of the Omer. In doing so, I hope to notice all the small things that contribute to fostering our wonderful community. I hope in engaging in these two rituals my attention will be drawn to the overlooked lessons I have learned from so many of our community members that enable me to be a part of, and serve this wonderful community.

SITUATIONAL AWARENESS ACTIVE SHOOTER MITIGATION PERSONAL PROTECTION SECURITY TRAINING April 9, 2024

Andy Kemp of Kemp Protective Services will provide a training on Tuesday, April 9, 2024, at 6:30pm for the Beth Jacob Congregation. The training is intended to help our congregation to become more proactive with situational awareness, personal protection, and active shooter mitigation.

At this time of increased antisemitism, we will learn to perceive, and effectively respond to one's surroundings. The training will identify effective actions to mitigate casualties for our personal protection.

The trainer, Andy Kemp has over 15 years of private security experience, and is currently the security director for Torah Academy and owner of Kemp Protective Services, LLC. SHUL CLOUD INTEGRATION

ShulCloud is Beth Jacob's synagogue management software system. We use it for all manner of record keeping and communications with our community, and we continue to work diligently to clean up - and update - information from our old systems, including household account information, personal information, and Yahrzeits. As we mentioned in our last Kol Ya'akov update, properly observing Yahrzeits is one of the highest priorities we have. To that end, one of the things we use ShulCloud for is sending out Yahrzeit letters to observers. If you did not receive a Yahrzeit letter you expected, please let us know so that we can fix our ShulCloud information in a timely manner.

BUILDING UPDATE

Over the past 18 months, our synagogue has undergone several repairs, replacements, and updates, including repainting the chapel, education wing hallways, and youth lounge, updating paper towel and toilet paper dispensers, replacing fluorescent lamps with LED bulbs, installing name plaques on staff doors, adding a new sound system in the sanctuary, updating the heating system, replacing the kitchen oven, repairing the foyer heater, updating the nursery, adding security cameras, coating windows with shatter-resistant film, and replacing the security system.

BOARD & COMMITTEE UPDATES

SECURITY COMMITTEE

We painted the fire lanes and reinstalled fire lane signs, installed three more cameras around the building, (funded by generous donations of two congregants), the front-entry outside lights are working again, all the evacuation routes around the building from emergency doors to the parking lot are identified with stakes in case there is a need to evacuate. The kitchen door has been replaced and 3M protective film has been installed on all exterior-facing windows and glass doors, and all smoke detectors have been upgraded and are functional.

Our BJC Security Greeters and Security Captains recently participated in a tabletop exercise with Mendota Heights Chief of Police Kelly McCarthy to address an active shooter situation. The Security Team felt empowered by this training.

S4 - SAINT PAUL AREA SYNAGOGUES SECURITY SYMPOSIUM

The Beth Jacob Security Committee held S4—Saint Paul area Synagogues Security Symposium on January 17, 2024, moderated by BJC Security Committee Chair Benjamin Bejar, featuring special agents from the FBI, the BCA, and local law enforcement experienced in counter-terrorism, cyber security, and threat management assessments. The panel included Mendota Heights Police Department Capt. Wayne Wegener, BCA Special Agent AJ Carlson, FBI Senior Special Agent Jake Iverson, FBI Special Agent Uri Rosenwald.

This was a well-attended event by the BJC Security Team and other synagogue shomrim who learned from these experts on addressing these difficult times of increased antisemitism.

TALMUD WITH RABBI JUSTIN HELD POSTPONED UNTIL SUMMER

Tablet Magazine Editor Liel Leibovitz recently wrote about the Talmud, "to the extent that the Talmud can even be called a book—it's more accurately described as "a drift net for catching God"—it's a truly magnificent one. Because in touching on virtually every human experience, from passing wind to losing a loved one, the Talmud is, arguably, humanity's first, greatest, and still most astonishing self-help book." Join Rabbi Justin Monday nights as we use Tractate Ta'anit as one of our vessels for "catching God." Tractate Ta'anit (fasts) discusses fixed public fast days, fasts decreed to avoid calamity, and individual fast days. No Talmud background or Hebrew fluency is required to join, and texts will always be provided in English and Hebrew. Come weekly or pop in and pop out. Your presence is always welcome.
