Here is your packing list:

Clothing - check your weather app for Ogden, Iowa – As of now, the forecast calls for lows around 35 degrees and highs around 60, perhaps some rain. The ground will be wet, so I recommend good shoes/boots or at least an extra pair for walking. Mornings and evening will be chilly so bring a jacket, hat, gloves. As a reminder, the cabins are heated. Bedding and towels will be provided, but feel free to bring a favorite pillow or fleece blanket.

Specialty Items:

Toiletries (deodorant, hairbrush, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, etc.)
Tallit, Tefillin, and Kippot - see note below
Medications - speak to your chapter youth director if you prefer the youth director is in charge of teen's medication

Shabbat Dress Attire

To celebrate and mark the important distinction between Shabbat and the weekday, Shabbat dress attire is required. The following attire is acceptable for Shabbat:

Slacks, khakis, dresses or skirts - if dresses or shorts for any gender are deemed "too short or too tight" your teen will be asked to change clothes Blouses, collared shirts or sweaters with sleeves

Since we are at a retreat center a bit more casual is OK, but no jeans, or ragged/torn clothing.

Religious Garb

Convention is a time when we come together to practice Judaism as a community, sharing common traditions and trying new experiences. Each participant is expected and encouraged to bring and use a head covering at appropriate times, and tallit and tefillin for shacharit (morning) services. We recognize that you may not own these items. Please be in touch with your synagogue Rabbi or chapter youth director to borrow tallit and tefilin. We will strive to have extras available as well. There will be USYers and staff available to help those who need any guidance in putting on these ritual items. Other teens may want to use t'fillin who don't own a set, so please bring yours to share.
