March 29 - Mazal Toy to Toya Resnick-Schwarcz on their Bat Mitzvah





Tablet Magazine editor Liel Leibovitz recently wrote about the Talmud, "to the extent that the Talmud can even be called a book—it's more accurately described as 'a drift net for catching God'—it's a truly magnificent one. Because in touching on virtually every human experience, from passing wind to losing a loved one, the Talmud is, arguably, humanity's first, greatest, and still most astonishing self-help book." Join Rabbi Justin Monday nights as we use Tractate Ta'anit as one of our vessels for "catching God." Tractate Ta'anit (fasts) discusses fixed public fast days, fasts decreed to avoid calamity, and individual fast days. No Talmud background or Hebrew fluency is required to join, and texts will always be provided in English and Hebrew. Come weekly or pop in and pop out. Your presence is always welcome. For the Sake of Heaven – Argue!

Talmudic Disagreements and their Lessons for Civil Discourse

The sages of the Talmud were no strangers to disagreement; indeed, the foundation of the rabbinic tradition lies in the thoughtful examination of differing opinions. But what happens when both sides of an argument refuse to yield? The Talmud provides profound and timeless teachings on how to ensure that our disputes are conducted "for the sake of Heaven."

In this class, we will delve into a variety of rabbinic texts to uncover the wisdom behind constructive disagreement and its relevance to fostering civil discourse in our own time. Together, we'll explore how opposing viewpoints can both be considered the "words of the living God." While familiarity with Hebrew, Aramaic, or the Talmud is welcome, it is by no means required—what matters most is an open mind and a readiness to engage in thoughtful dialogue.

The fee for this class is \$36 for Beth Jacob members. Cost is not an obstacle.



Creation Renewed:

Sustaining the World that Sustains Us

Earl Schwartz Feb 18, Feb 25, March 4, March 11 6:30-7:30

In Who Renews Creation, co-authored in 1993 by Earl Schwartz and Rabbi Barry Cytron, a hundred-year-old packet of letters is discovered, sent by a newly established Jewish farming community in North Dakota to a rabbi in Chicago. In the letters, community members ask for guidance regarding the halakhah of caring for their physical environment, what they owed the other creatures with whom they shared their bit of earth, and their



environmental responsibilities toward their neighbors. The sources the rabbi intended to cite are noted in the margins of the letters, but his responses, including how he intended to use the sources, are missing. Absent the rabbi's replies, reflecting on those sources and composing responses are now our responsibility, and the subject of this series.







BOARD & COMMITTEE UPDATES

KITCHEN COMMITTEE

Many of us who were members of Beth Jacob before the COVID pandemic fondly remember kitchen duty. On a regular basis, each congregant who was able was assigned to help prepare kiddush and clean up. Now that we are back, we have been relying on volunteers to sign up to prepare food and clean up after kiddush. This has become increasingly difficult as many of the same people volunteer week after week and they are getting burnt out. We are frequently experiencing kiddushes with very few crew members, and this is leading to mashes getting burned out as well.

The Kitchen Committee, with the blessing of the Board of Trustees, has decided that we need to return to a new system of assigned kitchen crews. The committee, together with the office staff, is working on the details of how this system will best work out. Our goal is to be ready to implement this in January. Please rest assured that for sure, members can opt out if they are unable to perform these duties, and only one adult will be expected from families with small children. SHULCLOUD UTILIZATION

ShulCloud is Beth Jacob's synagogue management software system. We use it for all manner of record keeping and communications with our community, and we continue to work diligently to clean up and update information from our old systems, including household account information, personal information, and Yahrzeits.

Some of the things we have been working on since our last report:

- Reviewing our membership account categories in order to accurately reflect our community.
- Working to integrate ShulCloud with a new financial accounting system for our office.
- Examining the feasibility of rolling out a new ShulCloud mobile app for cell phones.

Properly observing Yahrzeits is one of the highest priorities we have. To that end, one of the things we use ShulCloud for is sending out Yahrzeit letters and E-mails to observers. If you did not receive a Yahrzeit letter you expected, please let us know so that we can fix our ShulCloud information in a timely manner.
